SERMON Luke 2:8-14 The Angels of Christmas

OFFERING

LIGHTING OF THE CANDLES

The pastor takes the light from the Christ candle to the assistants. They pass the light on to the congregation. Tip only the unlighted candle. Do not tip the lighted candle to avoid dripping the wax! Hold the candles straight up and the wax will not drip. Thank you.

As the light of these candles brings light to the darkness, it reminds us of Christ, our Light, the child in the manger of Bethlehem, a Saviour suffering our death on the cross, and soon to come from His throne on high as Judge of all. He is our Light here on earth and the eternal Light who enlightens heaven, where there is no need of candle or sun. Rejoice! The Light of the World has come. The light transforms us with the brightness of His glory.

> This is the message we have heard from Him and proclaimed to you, that God is light and in Him there is no darkness at all.

If we say we have fellowship with Him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth.

But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another,

and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin.

As a symbol of God coming into our midst to live with us the Lectionary is carried into the midst of the congregation, where the Holy Gospel is read. The congregation turns to face the reading of the Holy Gospel.
