STEWARDSHIP BLURB: Revelation 14:6 – “Then I saw another angel flying directly overhead, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people.” During the Reformation, this text was used to refer to Luther’s ministry and the Lutheran message. We have an eternal Gospel to proclaim. Christ has freed us from our sins without any works on our part. We are saved by grace alone! And, ironically enough, Luther said this should make him the “apostle of works. Once we are freed by grace, we are truly free to serve God in works that flow from thankfulness and praise.

SUNDAY BIBLE STUDY: Next Sunday is our last Sunday Bible study with Pastor Schneider. We will be looking at Luke 20:27-40 where Jesus proves the resurrection to the Sadducees. Life with Jesus is going to be so much better than marriage, that we won’t get married anymore. Everyone is welcome to attend.

#YOUNGOLDLUTHERANS: Being a 'cradle Lutheran' and given my lifelong love of music, I have always appreciated the church's historic liturgy and Lutheran hymnody. However, it wasn't until I was attending University that I came to realize what a treasure these are.

In many denominations, weak theology has led to the replacing of hymns which proclaim the truths of Scripture with songs in the 'Jesus is my boyfriend' genre and sentimentalized holiday songs with little substance. The historic liturgy is often deemed irrelevant, and worship has more in common with a pop concert than worshiping the awe-full God who made heaven and earth.

Orthodox Lutheranism holds God's Word above all else. In the Divine Service, God comes to us in Word and Sacrament, bringing us life and salvation in the forgiveness of our sins. We worship in reverence Him who became man and died on a cross for the sins of the world. We join with the saints of all time and places, praising Him with hymns that proclaim His work of salvation, call on our heavenly Father as dear children, and give us comfort in times of trouble.
